Because of you, we have worked with the world's most silenced young women, including young women in refugee camps who have escaped conflict in Syria, Yazidi young women tortured by ISIS, young women survivors of trafficking, young women who suffered unspeakable horrors in camps in Libya, and young women subject to heinous domestic violence here in the U.S. and Russia.

Because of you, in 2019, we marked our 10-year anniversary of designing and implementing transformative initiatives by:

- Receiving two major awards: one from the U.S. Embassy Moscow, implemented by <u>Eurasia Foundation</u>, to design and implement leading-edge <u>webinars</u> on gender-based violence and inequality across Russia and the U.S. in 2020, and one from the U.S. Diplomatic Mission to Kazakhstan to expand <u>Girl-talk-Girl</u> to Kazakhstan in 2020.
- Launching our newest and continuing global initiative entitled StrengthIN, which creates a paradigm shift in humanitarian aid by offering a more human and holistic blueprint for development.
- Presenting in two sessions at the <u>63rd annual Commission on the Status of Women</u> at the United Nations, including our interactive event <u>"Hear Her"</u> with our incredible Co-Sponsor <u>SayitForward.org</u>, which had standing room only.
- Releasing powerful work by participants in our Her{connect}Her
 program in Skaramagas Refugee Camp in Greece, including the e-book "The Suffering of the Olive Branch in Afrin" written and illustrated by Hamrin Hanan who fled war in Syria.

- Expanding our reach exponentially at events and conferences across the U.S. and Europe, and through an upcoming trip to engage girls in Rajasthan, India, we have continued to amplify young women's voices and demonstrate how our unique, evidence-based methodology fosters sustainable connection and compassion.
- Running multiple major advocacy campaigns, including #LedbyHER, powerfully showing how young women across borders are leading the way in taking a stand against sexual violence and rape.
- Growing our network, including our new board member, the unstoppable social impact investor <u>Natasha Müller</u>, and other invaluable advocates and partners, like the <u>Charter for Compassion</u>.

This letter, this list, and these honors I write about neither scratch the surface nor come close to the work accomplished and to your place in making our work happen. Footage is fueled by and constituted of our collective power, love, hope, inspiration, toil, authenticity, and the unyielding compassion of each and every one of you: **Footage is us.**

Program Expansion

StrengthIN

StrengthIN is Footage's initiative and awareness campaign on sustainable development and the mental, social, and emotional wellbeing of young women. Launching StrengthIN in 2019, Footage developed this new initiative (program implementation TBA) and advocated for young women's well-being through events internationally and social media.

Why is StrengthIN ground-breaking? First off, it offers a more human and holistic blueprint for development by taking into account overlooked basic needs, such as self-worth and connection. These needs are virtually ignored in global crises—times when feelings of shame and disconnection are amplified.

With support, Footage provided a series of events for StrengthIN in New York City and London (with such speakers as Dr. Amalina Bakri) and engaged the public on social media, asking questions like: Do you think connection is a basic human need? Thank you to everyone who has generously donated and invested in young women with us. Stay tuned for program updates.

Program Expansion

WebinHERS and Girl-talk-Girl Kazakhstan

In 2019, Footage received two awards from the U.S. Department of State to begin new projects on voice and GBV, set for implementation in 2020.

With our third Peer-to-Peer Dialogue Program Award from the U.S. Embassy Moscow, implemented by Eurasia Foundation, we are continuing to amplify the voices of young women affected by GBV across the U.S and Russia through WebinHERS. Through consultation with diverse young women and grassroots organizations across both countries, we are providing educational and interactive webinars on GBV, reaching and connecting young women worldwide.



For **17 years**, Rodnik has promoted gender equality, serving women and children, including those affected by marital conflict, migrant women, and victims of human trafficking.

Further, with a Public Diplomacy Program Award from the U.S. Diplomatic Mission to Kazakhstan, we are expanding our Girl-talk-Girl digital storytelling program and platform on GBV to include young women in Kazakhstan. Thus far, Girl-talk-Girl has reached and connected young women in Russia, the U.S., Ukraine, and Chile. Supported by our new partner organization, Rodnik, young women in the Almaty region will spark dialogue and social change on the GBV ever-present in their lives. As part of the project, Footage is also providing training in our unique storytelling methodology to NGOs working with young women throughout the country.



Our Impact: Internationally

15 million

adolescent girls (aged 15-19) worldwide have experienced forced sex at some point in their life. **Only** 1% ever sought professional help.

1 in 5

women reporting physical or sexual abuse had **never before told anyone about it.**

70%

of sexual assault victims experience moderate to severe distress, a larger percentage than for any other violent crime.

Our participants have first-hand experiences with these traumas, and are typically silenced.

After their experience with Footage programs, we surveyed their well-being:

100% of participants felt an **increase in compassion toward themselves.**

100% of respondents reported a better understanding of their own perspective and beliefs toward GBV.

100% of respondents reported a better understanding of how GBV affects women and girls throughout the world.

100% of participants believed they could apply skills learned to gaining or advancing employment and empowering themselves economically.

In 10 years, Footage has directly served more than 700 participants in more than 10 countries and indirectly supported thousands of women and girls around the world.
